2	Be able to organise key events by their time in the day	Learner will put in order 3 key events, when given the time of the event, on 2 occasions. E.g 10.00 have a break, 8.00 get dressed, 12.00 have lunch
3	Be able to recognise analogue and digital clocks telling the same time.	 Learner will match a given o'clock or half past analogue time to the corresponding digital time on 4 occasions Learner will match a given o'clock or half past digital time to the corresponding analogue time on 4 occasions

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4	Be able to determine if a time or event is am or pm	Learner will organise o'clock and half past times and events into groups of am, pm or both e.g. brushing teeth, 12 noon, when it gets dark.
5	Be able to make given o' clock and half past times on a clock	Learner will move the hands of a clock or change the time on a digital clock to show an o' clock or half past time given by another person.
