These skills are at the core of 'The ASDAN Way' – our pedagogical model that emphasises iterative, co-constructed learning, formative feedback, and learners as active agents in their own educational journeys.

Embedded in ASDAN's skills-based curriculum is the **plan, do, review** cycle – a structured yet flexible learning loop that encourages intentional learning, implementation, and reflection – a pattern found across our courses.

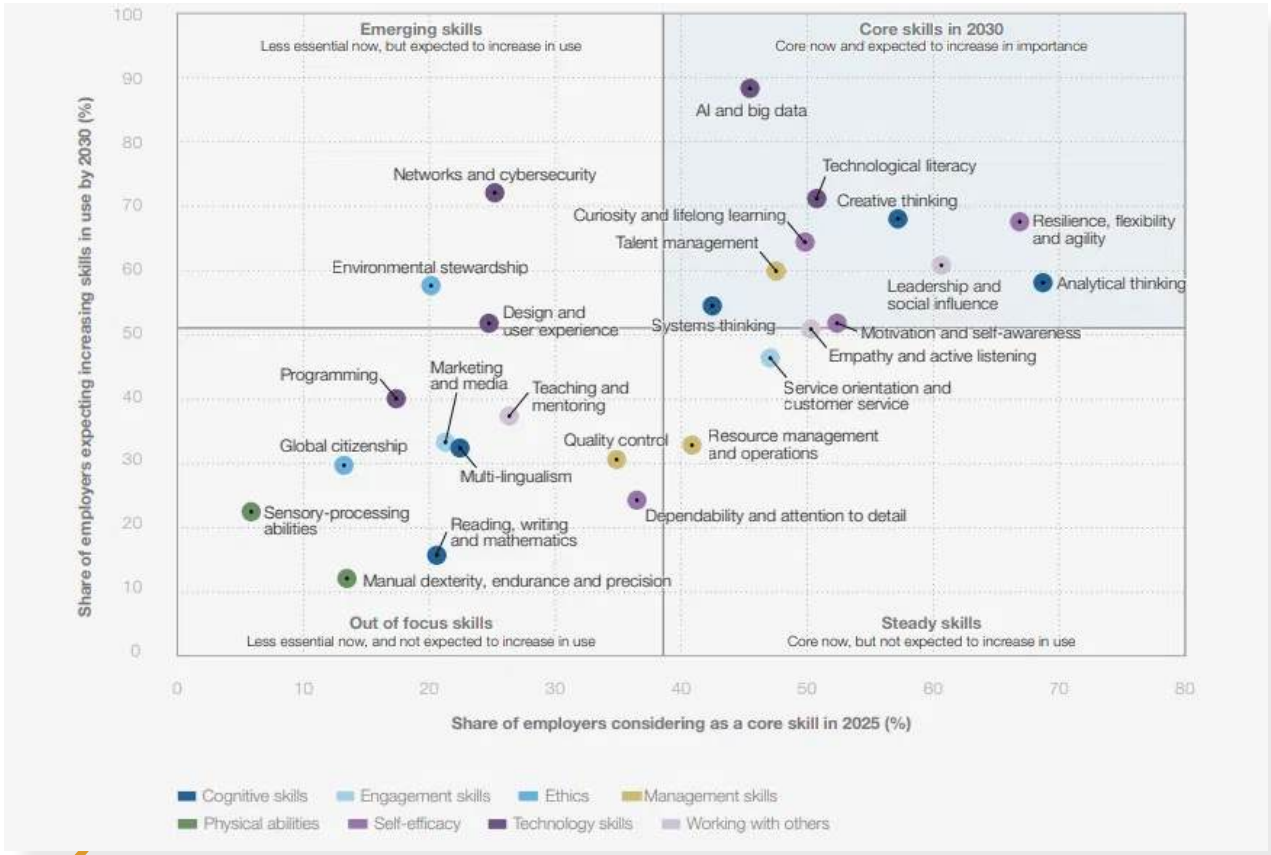
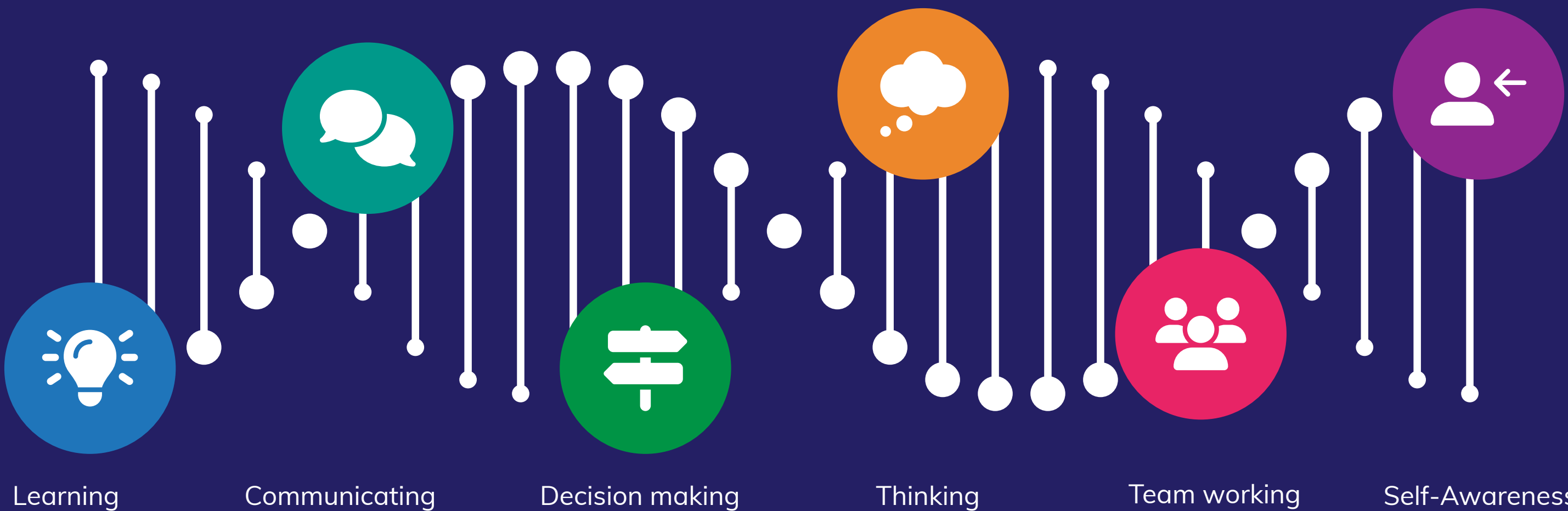

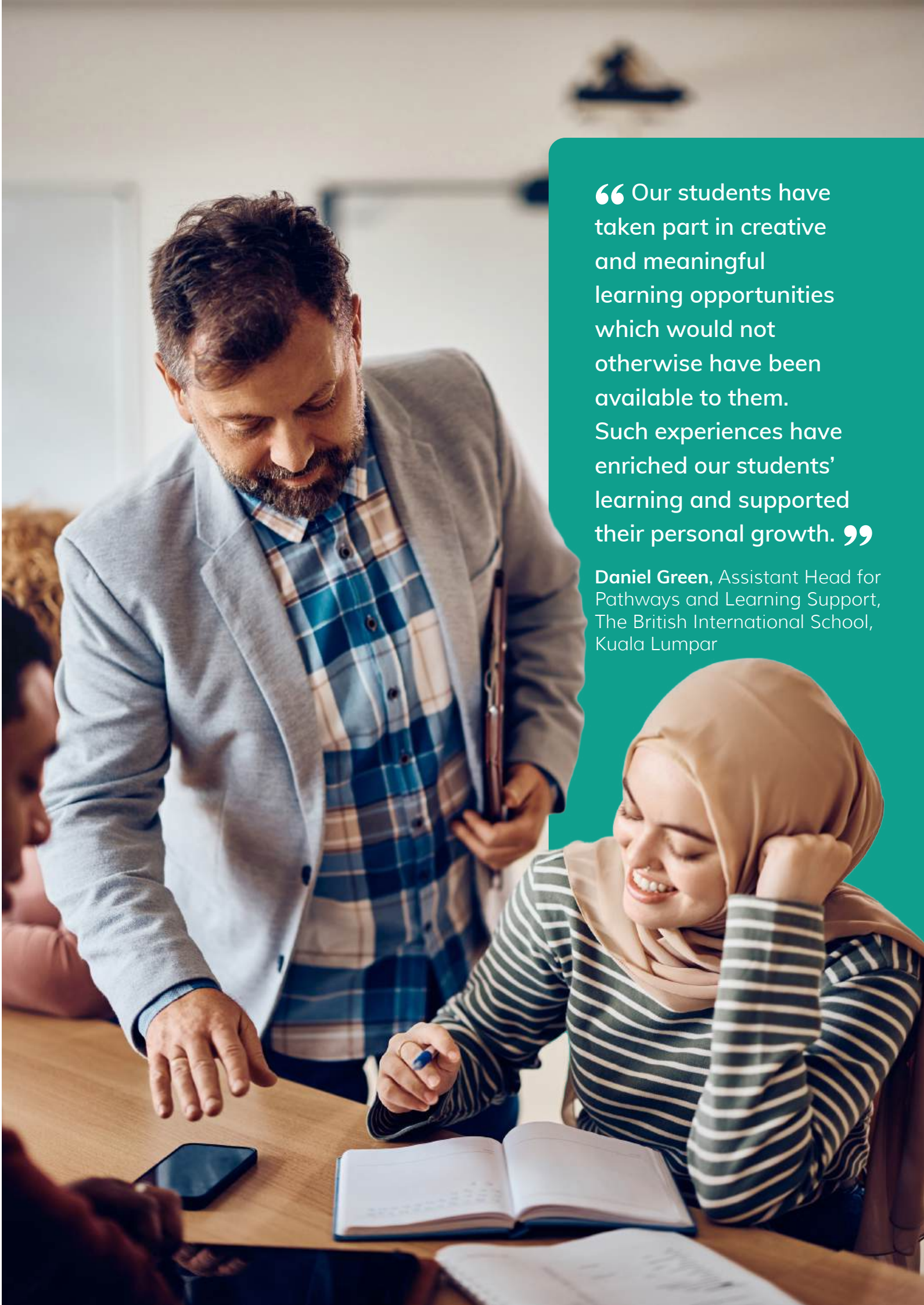

ASDAN in action: Unlocking learner confidence and creativity

ASDAN courses have been growing in popularity in the United Arab Emirates. Teresa Parker, Learning Support Assistant at Dubai British School, explains the impact that an ASDAN course has had on Mia, a 14-year-old with special educational needs:

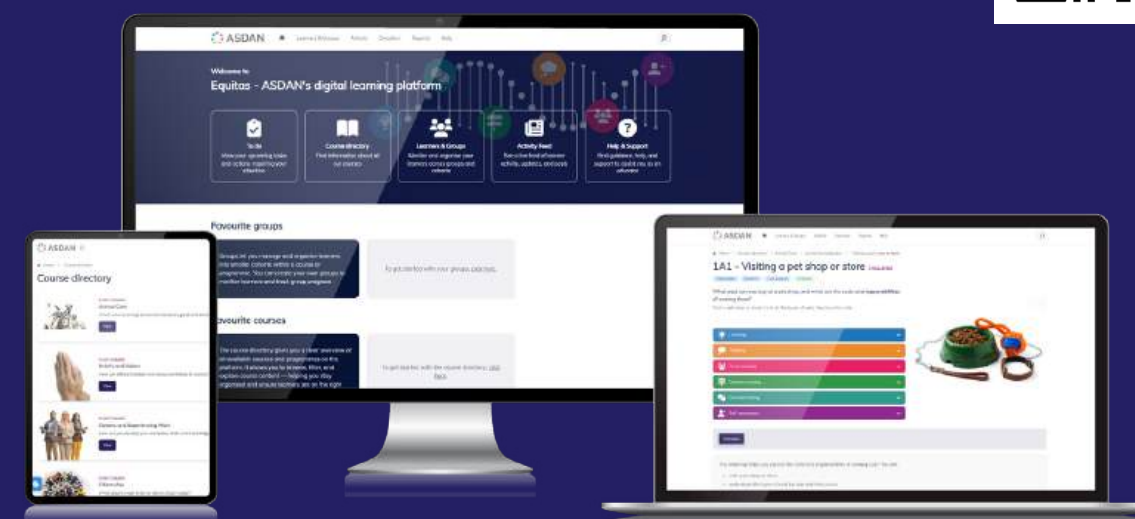


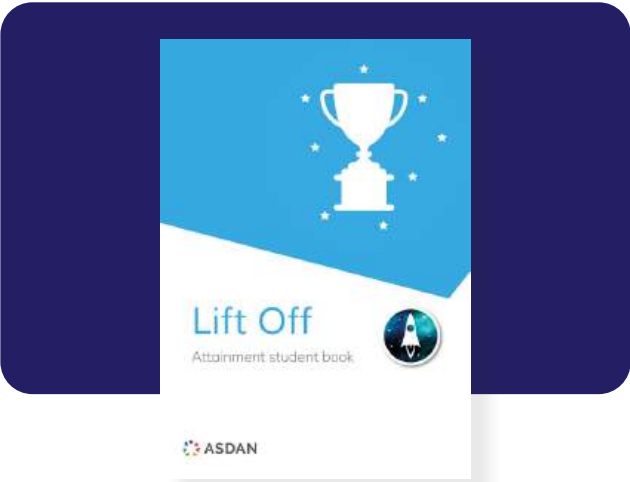

Lift Off

Lift Off is an activity-based programme that develops personal development skills and self-esteem to help learners make a successful transition from primary to secondary school.

Designed to develop learners’ skills in 18 key characteristics across three modules:

- **Awareness:** Strengths, Possibilities, Challenges, Routes, Information, Support
- **Aspiration:** Self-worth, Self-efficacy, Self-control, Purpose, Resilience, Determination
- **Attainment:** Planning, Communication, Self-improvement, Application, Collaboration, Problem solving

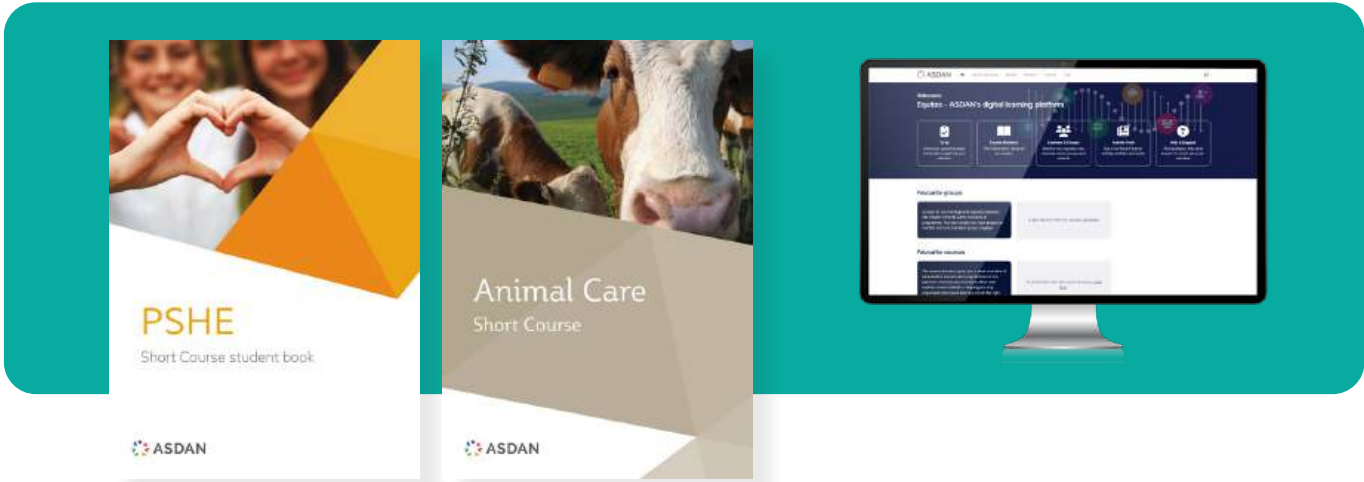
Key Steps

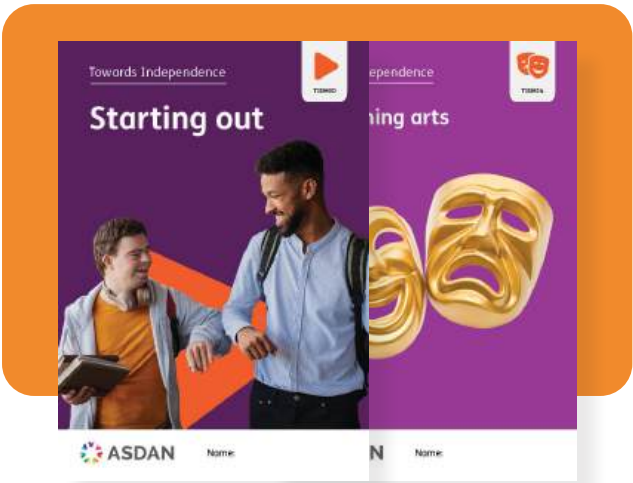
New Horizons

Towards Independence

Towards Independence accredits personal, social, work-related and independent living skills for learners with SEND working towards Entry Level 1 to Entry Level 3.

88 modules available, including sensory options for learners with PMLD (profound and multiple learning difficulties).

With 88 modules on an expansive range of topics, this programme offers formal recognition for small steps of personal achievement towards individual goals for adults and learners preparing for adulthood.

Transition Challenge

Transition Challenge offers a learner-centred, activity-based curriculum. This programme is available at two levels:

Sensory

Offers a developmental perspective for learners with PMLD and rewards every step of learning and achievement. Transition Challenge: Sensory contains four modules:

- Communication and Interaction
- Cognition
- Physical
- Self-help and Independence

Introduction and Progression

Provides a framework of activities linked to curriculum subjects. It develops learners' independent living and personal skills through five modules:

- Knowing how
- Making choices
- Feeling good
- Moving forward
- Taking the lead

Workright

Workright provides a framework to develop a range of basic transferable employability skills. It can be used in a variety of settings.

The Workright student book contains four modules:

- Health and safety in the workplace
- Responsibilities in the workplace
- Working with others
- You at work

The learner is required to demonstrate the knowledge or skills while on a work-based or work experience programme.

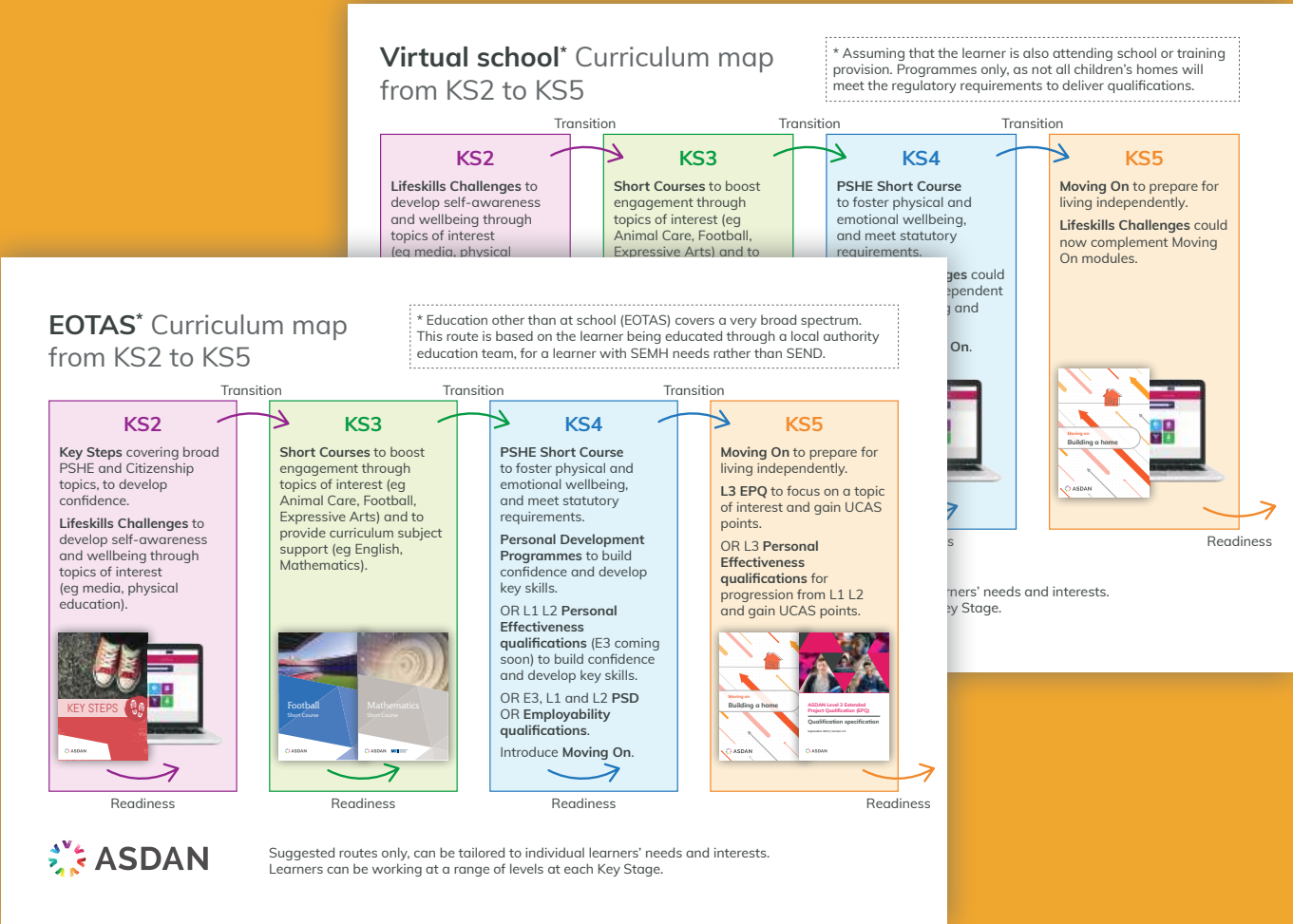
